### 2013 Exhibit Opens May 18 – 1 PM-4PM

Please join us at the opening of the 2013 exhibit, "Romantic Rhinebeck: Textiles Through the Past."

The Museum is pleased to offer an exhibit for 2013 and 2014, which will show textiles from various age groups as donated by local families. The exhibit includes clothing as well samplers, homemade domestic items such as doilies, dresser scarves, homespun, quilts and more.

In addition there are military items to complement the uniform from WWI that will be on display. Other accessory items include a series of men's and ladies' personal grooming items, hats, and more. Selected objects from our violet and children's toy collection will be used to help tell the story of the clothing.

A display of period Godey's Lady prints will be shown as will a large variety of Rhinebeck Photographs taken at various times showing locals in their finery and daily wear.





In 2014, we will continue the textile theme but materials will be changed to reflect other Museum materials.

The exhibit opens Saturday May 18 with an Open House from 1 to 4. Refreshments will be served. Please join us!

# Museum Outreach and Partnerships:

Members of the Museum Board are working with other local organizations to promote our historic resources and provide unique programs to the community.

Curator Steven Mann, gave a program on the Quakers in the Rhinebeck area at the January meeting of the Rhinebeck Historical Society. If you missed this program you can view it on PANDA; borrow a DVD from the Starr Library or through the Rhinebeck Historical Society website (http://www.rhinebeckhistoricalsociety.org/videos.html). In May, Steven Mann will be leading a tour of the Wurtemburg

Cemetery in Rhinebeck for the Rhinebeck Historical Society. Last year's tour of the Rhinebeck Cemetery is available on DVD at the Starr Library.

Elizabeth Clarke and Beverly Kane are putting together a Civil War exhibit using parts of Museum and Rhinebeck Historical Society's collections. The exhibit will be on display in the Starr Library beginning in May of 2013.

On September 8, at the Elmendorph Inn, Steven Mann will be speaking to the Egbert Benson Historical Society on slavery in the Rhinebeck-Red Hook-Milan area.

On September 19, Steven Mann will be speaking to the IBM Retirees at their monthly program. The topic is "The Whaling Industry in Poughkeepsie -- with Some Help From the Quakers".

Beverly Kane coordinated an exhibit on the history of the Starr Institute/Library for its 150th anniversary in 2012. This exhibit used resources from the Museum of Rhinebeck History, Rhinebeck Historical Society, Wilderstein Preservation, and local collectors.

Sarah Bachelier and Steven Mann are working with the Neher-Elseffer Palatine Farmstead. Sarah is working with Director Marilyn Hatch to put together a curriculum package to use with groups of various ages. Steven, the Farmstead's Curator and member of the Farmstead Committee, is working with

Krista Miller on an interpretive exhibit on former residents of the house. They will also put together a showcase of artifacts found at the home since the Quitman Resource Center took possession of the property in 2002.

Kay Verrilli and Steven Mann will be working with David Miller, of the Rhinebeck Historical Society, and representatives from the Town's Committee on Aging to do videotaped oral history interviews with local residents.
